Diane has nearly 10 years of experience as a venture capitalist, investing in young healthcare, financial services, and technology companies. She was Vice President and an officer of American Century Ventures, Inc., a \$100 million start-up corporate venture fund for an affiliate of JP Morgan. Her portfolio companies included Archipelago (merged with the NYSE), Euronet (NASDAQ: EEFT), FolioFN, StarMine (acquired by Reuters), Tradepoint (acquired by virt-x) and WR Hambrecht. In addition to venture investing, Diane co-managed six start-up public equity portfolios that were invested with corporate capital. These portfolios eventually went to market as the top quartile performing American Century Legacy Funds.

Before American Century, Diane was at Bessemer Venture Partners, a leading venture capital firm in Boston, in their healthcare practice. She was active in Bessemer's investments in Vista Hospice (NASDAQ: VSTA), DataMedic (acquired by InfoCure) and Advantage Schools (acquired by Mosaica Education).

Diane has written extensively in the public and professional press about the venture capital industry and the financing of young companies. She is also the author of two books on venture capital. *Venturing Forward* is geared towards an audience of entrepreneurs and discusses the equity financing process from company formation to IPO. *Angels and IPOs: Policies for the Sustainable Equity Financing of Irish Small Businesses*, a public policy book about the Irish government's venture capital financing of small businesses.

Diane was previously a Visiting Fellow at Trinity College Dublin in Ireland, and is currently an Adjunct Lecturer at Babson, teaching MBA courses on developing entrepreneurial opportunities. She is also an Executive-in-Residence at the Center for Women's Leadership at Babson.

Diane currently leads the global knowledge efforts on capital markets for McKinsey & Co.'s Corporate Finance practice. Her work includes serving as an expert resource to clients and consulting teams in Asia, Europe and North American on issues such as IPOs, privatizations, financing, investor communications and capital markets strategy.
